

Greenpeace gives most supermarkets failing grade on sustainable fish

Greenpeace released its second annual ranking of Canadian supermarkets. It gives most supermarkets a failing grade. The only exception was the awarding of first place - and the only passing grade - to Overwaitea for its promotion of sustainable fishing practices. The grading was based on seven criteria, including seafood policies and promotion efforts, traceability and labelling, and also depended on whether a given store sells endangered fish species, and if so, how many. Costco Canada came in last out of eight major supermarket chains in the country and received Greenpeace's lemon award for overall inaction.
