On Thursday March 31 DFO announced a reduction in the overall shrimp quota for the east coast of NL. This was prompted by scientific evidence indicating some stock decline. It also announced that this reduction would result in a 40% cut in the quota available to the inshore shrimp fleet and only a 10% cut in the offshore guota. This generated a heated reaction from inshore fishermen and Earle McCurdy, President of the NL Fishermen's Union. McCurdy said that inshore shrimp harvesters and plant workers in the province were getting the "royal shaft" from the Harper government. He said that it's the equivalent of shutting down four shrimp plants: "I think it's absolutely disgraceful, flies completely in the face of adjacency ... and if allowed to stay in place would be devastating to coastal communities, particularly those with fish plants."
