Writing in The Tyee, well-known biologist Alexandra Morton alleges that B.C. fish farms have been hiding facts about disease outbreaks at salmon feedlots. She claims that IHN disease has been "raging through the migratory corridors of the collapsing Fraser sockeye" for years and that B.C. salmon feedlots have been hiding this fact from the regulators and the public. The Canadian Food Inspection Agency reports that Canada has not fully met "any" of the fish disease reporting requirements set by the World Health Organization for Animal Health. According to Morton unreported disease outbreaks at salmon feedlots have contributed to the Fraser sockeye crash.
