

Rising sea drives Panama islanders to mainland

According to Reuters, rising seas from global warming, coming after years of coral reef destruction, are forcing thousands of indigenous Panamanians to leave their ancestral homes on low-lying Caribbean islands. Rising sea level on a handful of islands in an archipelago off Panama's northeastern coast threatens the livelihood of nearly half of the 32,000 semi-autonomous Kuna people. The move of islanders to the mainland will be one of the first that can be blamed on rising sea levels and global warming.
